NOTICE OF NONDISCRIMINATION

High Point Christian School is a private, nonprofit, nondenominational institution founded for the purpose of developing and implementing an educational program that is thoroughly Christian both in content and practice. As such, HPCS recognizes that in Christ, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, male nor female." Therefore, High Point Christian School admits students of any race, color, sex, national or ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school.

Acceptance into the program is not guaranteed. Students receiving any need based funds must reapply on an annual basis. Financial aid is granted only as funds are available.

In addition to the Financial Aid application and tax documents, applicants must complete the MCS Need Based Financial Aid Part 2 Questionnaire as well as submit the most recent report card and standardized test results.

Families in the program who are already enrolled must apply by May first for the coming school year. They must be fully registered with all registration fees paid in full, or fees waived. Any previous debt to the campus must first be paid before the application will be processed.

MCS reserves the right to require verification or inquiry of pertinent financial data, including 1040 tax returns.

Households desiring to participate in the Need Based Financial Aid (NBFA) Part 2, should submit all paperwork by June 15, 2016. After that date, applications will only be considered as funds are available.

Steps in Applying for the NBFA Part 2 Program

1. Complete the following documents, and submit to the school:
 - a. The scholarship application form
 - b. The tuition assistance questionnaire
 - c. the most recent financial documentation (W2 or tax return, if neither applicable please discuss with the school administrator the best way to document income for the past year)
 - d. The student's most recent report card
 - e. The student's most recent standardized test results.

(These documents will be reviewed by the Review Committee.)

If it is determined to continue the process:

2. Students entering 5th grade and above will be asked to write and submit an essay on why they want to continue their education at the MCS campus.
3. All students will take the entrance exam appropriate to their grade level.

If it is determined to continue:

4. An initial interview will be set up with parent/guardian(s), teacher, and administrator to determine what the "Partnership Plan" should look like and explain what the vision of MCS is and the expectations of the school and its community.

If it is determined to continue:

5. The school administration will draft the formal and binding "Partnership Plan*" based upon the discussion at the interview with teacher input.
6. A final admissions interview will take place, which includes someone from the review committee, the principal, and superintendent. Enrollment is contingent upon all parties being in agreement with and signing the "Partnership Plan," as well as all other school enrollment forms completed and submitted. The parent/guardian should be given a copy of the school parent handbook at this time.

- Continued participation in the NBFA Part 2 Program is contingent upon the parent/guardian and student fulfilling the requirements of the "Partnership Plan," as well as following the policies and guidelines of the school as laid out in the Parent Handbook.

*The partnership plan would be unique to this program and would include a list of what is needed to help the student be successful at the school (meals, after-school care, tutoring, transportation, etc) and how the family will be held accountable to partner with the school (volunteer, contact with mentor family, pay a portion, etc). The continued participation of a student in the NBFA Part 2 Program would be contingent upon the fulfillment of this plan. Development of the plan would include input from the teacher(s).

Other Notes:

- Funds will be set aside for students who receive financial aid from the NBFA Part 2 Program, if possible, for their academic career at Madison Christian Schools either K-8 or 9-12. (i.e. if a student enters in 6th grade funds will be set aside through the end of grade 8 for that student. If a student enters in 9th grade, funds will be set aside through 12th grade.)
- If a student participating in NBFA Part 2 no longer financially qualifies or enrollment is discontinued for any reason, the funds then revert back into the program and will be redistributed to another student based upon the qualifications of the program.
