Safety Protocol During Carpool



- Options for Pick Up
 - Assemble in carpool line access from east entrance.
 - Have your yellow family name tag visible on your visor.
 - Do not access by cutting.
 - Teachers in K-2 will bring your child(ren) to cars. Please do not get out of your vehicle unless buckling your child in the car seat.
 - Park & pick students up from carpool
 - After School Care
 - Students will be taken to pick up location.
- NO PETS, please!
- Following protocol by staying in our pre-determined lane of traffic is essential for student safety.

HPCS Dress Code



- The HPCS dress code applies to all K-8th students.
- The following are some important reminders...









Sleeveless shirts are acceptable but the shoulder must be at least three fingers wide.





No caps or hats may be worn in school.



Ripped jeans may be worn only if rips are at or below the fingertips (arms straight down at side).



Leggings may be worn, but only with a skirt or a top at least fingertip length that covers 360 degrees.



Shorts: Shorts (at or below fingertip level) may be worn April through October. No spandex.





Shorts with leggings underneath may be worn in winter. Shorts must still be fingertip length or longer.



Hooded sweatshirts must be worn with the hood down while inside the school.

Office Protocols

 - Advanced absence requests

- What is a "SCRIP" A piece of paper, plastic card, or phone app entitling the holder to goods or services.
- Scrip is one of the schools largest and most consistent fundraisers.
- Last year the program raised over \$8,630.00. \$4,200.00 was used by the school to help defray tuition costs. The remaining \$4,430.00 went back to families as a tuition rebate or can be used by other supporters to buy more scrip or donated back to the school.

Grocery Example



- The discount percentage at Woodman's is 5%.
- HPCS buys \$100 Woodman's cards for \$95. Each time one is sold, we make a rebate of 5% or \$5. 55% of that \$5 goes to your rebate account and 45% goes to HPCS.
- Do you spend \$500/month at Woodman's?
 - \$500 * 12 months = \$6,000 per year.
 - 5% of \$6,000 = \$300 per year in rebates
 - \$165 goes into your rebate account for distribution in December
 - \$135 goes to HPCS
- What about gas? Amazon? Culvers? Starbucks? iTunes? Best Buy? Kohl's? Gap? Subway? Wal-Mart? Target? Home Depot?

How To Get Involved?



- Orders for cards we keep in inventory that are submitted either online or by paper form by 2:30 on Monday will be ready for pick up on Tuesday morning; orders received by 2:30 on Thursday will be ready for pick up on Friday morning. Orders for physical cards not kept in inventory that are submitted online by 2:30 pm on Thursday will be available for pick up after school the following Thursday.
- <u>Download the Raise Right mobile app</u> and order SCRIPNow it's ready for immediate use in your Raise Right wallet.
- Register a physical gift card for easy reload in the app! (available for select cards)





- •Save some paperwork and place your SCRIP orders (including local cards like Woodmans, Culvers and Kwik Trip) using the app or online at <u>www.shopwithscrip.com</u>. (a small \$0.15 fee per purchase will be applied to your order)
- •You need to be registered with the High Point SCRIP program prior to using the app. **HPCS does not accept checks for online SCRIP orders.**
